Carefree Cares is an initiative developed to assist our neighbors and local community through different programs organized by the Carefree Activities Committee.


The Carefree Cares program seeks volunteers to support our neighbors in their time of need, give back to our community where we can, and to spread compassion and kindness at every available opportunity.

BUFFALO CREEK CLEANUP

As you may have noticed, an attempt was made to stop the creek bank's erosion near the property's playground equipment. Unfortunately, the good intentions have created a violation of state and federal requirements for maintaining a waterway.

The Grounds Committee will remove the concrete and asphalt paving from the creek to clean up the current condition. In hopes of using Carefree member volunteers and their wheelbarrows, we will remove the waste material from the creek bank and place it in the dumpster a little at a time.

Republic Services has permitted us to use up to 15% of the dumpster volume for each scheduled pick-up for the creek's waste material. According to the trash pick-up days, the Grounds Committee will schedule times to move the material to the dumpster. If you are interested in helping (and showing off a little muscle), please send an email to grounds@carefreeclub.org. Removing some of the material and carrying it to the dumpster will be on the agenda for Earth Day Cleanup as well.

The second facet of this problem is the water's increased volume and speed at the creek's S-curve. We contacted the project designer regarding the widening of County Line Road (more about that later.) We hope to have the design team address the issue

while the Buffalo Creek bridge is being renovated. It seems that with the development of Perry Township in Marion County, the water from roads and pavements that previously soaked into the ground are being directed to the creek more quickly than before. Some of you may recall the flood in 2008 that covered County Line Road, the Carefree North entrance, the clubhouse's parking lot, and the clubhouse itself. Fingers crossed that we can address the repairs north of County Line Road to reduce the curve's water rate. Moving forward, the better and easier it will be to handle.

Lastly, the Grounds Committee is in the process of addressing the erosion of the soil near the playground. We are in contact with several Civil Engineering firms qualified to design a solution for the creek erosion. The committee would like to suggest that an intern, or interns, might study and develop a solution to the problem and present the solution as part of their training. This solution will address our erosion concerns without placing our neighbors' banks across the creek and downstream in jeopardy. The Carefree Crocodiles Swim Team celebrates its 47th year, offering recreational programming for children ages 5-17 from Greenwood and the surrounding communities. Registration will be open in early April for an opportunity for children to "get their feet wet" with a splash of competitive swimming.

Our team members practice for one hour, four times a week, at the Carefree Club Pool. Practices are in the mornings on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, & Friday. The season begins the first week of June and ends July 11th.

While the program has made some great changes, we have kept all the things that make Carefree an outstanding place for you and your kids to spend your summer.

Charlotte, James, and three teenage children were original homeowners that moved to Carefree in August 1975. The family transferred from the St. Louis area and were initially looking for their forever home on Indianapolis's Northside. After many visits to Indiana, James and Charlotte were giving up hope. Charlotte returned back to St Louis with the children, while her husband stayed behind in hopes of finding that perfect home.

After a lengthy search, their realtor at the time mentioned a lovely neighborhood on the southside of Indianapolis. James and the realtor (Carlos Diaz's father, the 13News Anchor) went to scope the area. He called Charlotte to tell her that he not only found their home. But, had purchased it! Charlotte, shocked because she had never seen it, laughs as she recalls nothing but cornfields and stop signs along S.R. 135 at the time. As Charlotte reminisces the history of her life with her family in Carefree, she remembers the drive-in movie theater, currently Orchard Golf, as a favorite family activity.

Charlotte recalls the blizzard of 1978. With 5 inches of snow already on the ground, the blizzard brought another 15.5 inches of snow (20 inches total) and buried Indianapolis in a snow-covered mess.

"There were many times we thought about downsizing. Then we would come back home and say, "We just love it here." I love that the properties are kept up, and I love my neighbors. I also enjoy seeing younger families move in around us." says Charlotte.








