We hope you are enjoying all of the benefits of the Carefree Club, Inc. The privileges of membership include:

- Renting the club house

Carefree Club membership dues are collected from each lot owner annually to operate and maintain the pool and clubhouse grounds. Once a lot owner joins the Club, its membership becomes part of the deed and carries from one owner to the next. When a home is sold, the title company conveys membership information to the new owners at closing. Your lot may have been a member since Carefree was developed, or it may have joined at a later date, but once the lot becomes a member of Carefree Club, Inc., it will always be a member. Even if you do not take advantage of the pool, clubhouse, or other benefits of the Club, the dues are mandatory and payable each year.

The Club membership dues for this year are \$231.00 and are due by April 30, 2015.

POOL:

The pools will open for the season on Saturday, May 23rd at 11:00 a.m. The pool rules have been posted to the club website on the pool page

(http://www.carefreeclub.org/dnn/Pool/tabid/56/Default.aspx). A Cliff's Notes version is below for quick reference:

- You must bring your membership card/tag to the pool each time you come to the pool.
- The pool manager, assistant managers and life guards are in charge at all times.
- Pool staff will close the pool in the event of inclement weather (thunder, temperature below 70°, heavy rain, lightning or the threat of lightning).
- Children under age three are not permitted in the main pool. This includes the stairs and sitting on the gutters. This is to prevent an *E. coli* outbreak. Swim diapers are not leak-proof and not permitted in the main pool. Children age three and over must be fully potty-trained to be in the main pool.
- Children under age three need to wear swim diapers in the baby pool, and they
 are sold at cost at the concession stand. Please do not change diapers on the pool
 decks or chairs use the restrooms.
- Anyone using the diving board must be able to swim to the ladder unassisted.
 Children are now allowed to jump to someone below in the water as this can lead to injuries.
- Only forward/frontward jumps and dives are permitted on the diving board.
- No flotation devices are allowed in the diving well.
- There are no lifeguards on duty at the junior pool. Any child using the junior pool is the responsibility of their parent or guardian. Parents or guardians must remain at the Junior Pool while their child is in the junior pool. Children left unattended will be removed from the baby pool until the parent/guardian returns.
- Food is permitted in the picnic area only.
- No glass containers allowed anywhere on the pool decks.
- Both pools will be cleared of children the last ten minutes of each hour for a rest period. This time is for adult swimming (those 18 years and older).

Please review the complete pool rules and see the pool chair, pool manager or assistant managers if you have any questions.

The Carefree Swim Team will have 3-4 home meets, and on those days the pools will close at 4:00 p.m. These dates will be posted at the pool and on the pool page of the club website.

We will once again offer water aerobics to members and their guests. There is no charge or sign-up needed and no previous experience necessary. During June and July, the schedule will be 10-11 a.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; 6-7 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. If there is interest, we will add a class on Saturdays from 11 a.m. to noon. The schedule will also be posted at the pool. Shallow- and deep-water aerobics are offered. The August schedule will be posted at a later date. Pool shoes are recommended to protect your feet and provide traction for shallow-water aerobics.

We'll be having some 'fun days' in June and July for children with games and prizes. The information will be posted at the pool.

We're looking forward to another good summer and hope to see you there.

CLUBHOUSE:

The Carefree Clubhouse has had more updates this year. Both restrooms have been updated. A baby changing station has been installed in the women's restroom. - Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and holidays half day is \$80.00 or a full day for \$134.00
- Half day = 5 am 4 pm or 5 pm 4 am

*The above prices include sales tax.

The only requirements for renting the clubhouse are that you must be a Carefree Club member and that your dues are paid current. The Clubhouse Rental Agreement requires that the Clubhouse be returned to its **SAME CLEAN CONDITION** at the end of each rental so the next rental can also enjoy a clean Clubhouse. Also, all doors should be locked, all of the blinds closed, and prompt return of the key.

Carefree Crocodiles Swim Team



The Carefree Crocodiles Swim Team (CCST) is a recreational program offering children ages 5-17 from Carefree and surrounding communities an opportunity to "get their feet wet" with a splash of competitive swimming. Our team members practice for 1 hour four times a week at the Carefree Club Pool. Practices are mornings on M, T, Th, & F. During

practices, our coaching staff provides instruction on proper stroke technique, starts, turns, and other components necessary to compete in meets. Please note that the Swim Team is NOT a "Learn To Swim" or swim lessons program. If you are interested in such a program, please visit our swim lessons page. While it's not a requirement for team members to know all the strokes or to have perfect technique, they must be able to swim comfortably in deep water.

CCST is a member of the Community Swim Conference, and competes against five other teams from the surrounding Indianapolis area in dual meets. At the end of the season, a conference meet is held with all five teams participating. The dual meets, usually 2.5 to 3 hours long, are scheduled in the evenings beginning the third week in June with Conference meet scheduled for the second or third week in July.

Registration will open for the 2015 season around April 15th. The team will be limited to 140 swimmers.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS

Carefree Crime Watch Committee asks that you turn on your outside lights during the night hours.
